## TROOPS COLLECTION DRIVE

Each year, F3 runs a care package drive for troops – usually serving in Afghanistan. There are 11,000 troops still serving there. We will begin this project just before Veterans Day by visiting each class at Maple to talk to them about the kinds of treats we will be sending out: leftover Halloween candy, beef jerky, toiletries (for men and women), hand warmers, magazines and paperback books in new or like new condition. We also love to send letters out as well.

We will be collecting items from November 13-16 from classes at Maple. On the morning of November 17, we'll be packing up all of our items. This care package drive serves as a reminder each year that we are still a country at war. This project started at Maple during the 2007 troop surge in Iraq.

My students will be making posters and coming into classrooms in early November to talk about the project. They will come in on the mornings of Nov. 13-16 to collect items from each classroom.

We need volunteers to help! If you are able to lend a hand on Friday morning the 17th to help with taping up boxes and or bringing them to the Georgetown post office, please let me know. If you have questions about the project, please ask!

## FLU SHOTS

Please join us and help keep our schools, families and communities healthy and flu free this season!

Contact your provider for availability. Some pharmacy's will give flu shots to anyone over age 7.

Many people believe that seasonal influenza ("the flu") is much like the common cold and that it cannot be prevented. But, influenza is a serious and potentially dangerous disease. Each year students miss approximately 38 million school days due to the flu and each year parents miss more that 10 million workdays caring for their sick children.

According to the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention), the single best way to protect you and your family from influenza is to receive a "flu shot" each year. The CDC recommends that EVERYONE, over six months of age, should be vaccinated against the flu.
